In the Mennonite World Review writer John Longhurst shares a story from 1665 that happened in a small village (350 people) in England named Eyam. During that year the Black Death bubonic plaque (the second pandemic ever recorded) was wreaking havoc in Eurasia and North Africa. During that time a tailor in Eyam received a bolt of cloth from London that was carrying the virus on it. Before long many in the town started to get sick, including the tailor, who died within a week. When the residents of the town started to realize what was happening they wanted to flee to other towns to get away from the disease. That was when Eyam's Anglican priest convinced them not to go. He preached a sermon pleading with the people

to stay in their town instead of spreading the virus to other towns. He proclaimed that it was their Christian duty to stay and allow the plague to stop with them. The priest said that he would stay as well and do anything he could to help alleviate their suffering.

There is more to that story, but the example or lesson of it is clearly self-sacrifice and looking out for your neighbor. In Matthew 7:12 Jesus said, "Whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also for them." Those words are often referred to as "The Golden Rule" but I like to think of them more as a calling instead of rule. As the church of Jesus Christ we are called to help others, look out for others, and even sacrifice for others at different times, especially in such a time as this.

It has been an incredible blessing to hear how you are looking out, reaching out, and staying in touch with each other during these difficult days. Keep it up! We will get through this together and we will move forward together as Christ's church.



Article 23 - Confession of Faith In a Mennonite Perspective

Church's Relation to Government and Society

We believe that the church is God's "holy nation," called to give full allegiance to Christ its head and to witness to all nations about God's saving love.

The church is the spiritual, social, and political body that gives its allegiance to God alone. As citizens of God's kingdom, we trust in the power of God's love for our defense. The church knows no geographical boundaries and needs no violence for its protection. The only Christian nation is the church of Jesus Christ, made up of people from every tribe and nation, called to witness to God's Glory

In contrast to the church, governing authorities of the world have been instituted by God for maintaining order in societies. Such governments and other human institutions as servants of God are called to act justly and provide order. But like all such institutions, nations tend to demand total allegiance. They then become idolatrous and rebellious against the will of God.

As Christians we are to respect those in authority and to pray for all people, including those in government, that they also may be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth. We may participate in government or other institutions of society only in ways that do note violate the love and holiness taught by Christ and do not compromise our loyalty to Christ.
