The imagery sets the tone for our Advent season as we will move closer and closer to Jesus as each Sunday of Advent passes. Each week we will set out on a new leg of this journey toward Christ. Here is the roadmap for our journey ahead. On the first Sunday of Advent, we will be on the road to readiness; staying alert for Jesus' second coming (Mark 13:24–37). On the second leg of our journey, we will be on the road to repentance, confessing our sins as John the Baptist taught (Mark 1:1-8). On the third leg of our journey, we will be headed down the road to restoration and recognize that God will

ultimately overturn the injustices of our world (John 1:6-8, 19-28). Then comes Christmas Sunday, when we will be filled with joy as we find ourselves on the road to rejoicing, inspired by the Psalmist to praise God for the birth of Jesus Christ (Psalm 148). As the road winds down at the end of the month, the road to radiance will encourage us to bask in the glow of our God who shines for all people of all nations (Isaiah 61:10-62:3). At the end of our journey we will realize once again that Jesus is the culmination of all the ancient promises of scripture.

Let's head out and move "Forward Together" on this journey through the wonderful Advent and Christmas season. I hope to see you on the road...
