For several years, I have posted a great quote on the wall in my classroom for my students to see:

"Educating the mind without educating the heart is no education at all." ~Aristotle

With the intention of using this poster as a wise and meaningful lesson for my students, I find myself reviewing this message as a lesson more for myself. Funny how that works sometimes!

1 Corinthians 13:13 reads, "And now these three things remain: faith, hope and love, but the greatest of these is love." This is a popular and well known verse. Love is one of those things that often sounds easy, but sometimes humans guard love, or limit love to only certain people. The Corinthians are often used in wedding ceremonies. These passages are used to describe what a marriage, in God's eyes, should look like. Love is patient, kind, protects, trusts, hopes, perseveres. The Bible even says what love is not; it does not envy, does not boast, is not proud, does not dishonor, it is not selfish, not easily angered, and keeps no record of wrong.

These being values that every marriage and friendship should strive to uphold.
