A new year brings with it new beginnings and new goals. Many people often fashion these goals in the form of resolutions. I usually don't make resolutions but last year I did make a few goals. Later in the year I stumbled upon those goals and realized that I had actually achieved a few of them. While I can't remember exactly what they all were, I know a few of them I hadn't achieved and at that time knew I was not going to choose to work on them before the end of this year.

For Arthur Mennonite, a new year also brings with it a new vision and this year is no exception. Each time, our vision seeks to encourage us to progress in our collective walk with Jesus. The goal of a new vision is not to take us down some completely different path; it has no intentions of changing who we are at our core. Each time, our vision seeks to look at who we are today and then where we would like to be in five years. It gives us a narrower focus that hopefully enriches our broader Christian walk.

This fall we finalized such a vision and it is as follows:

By 2027, Arthur Mennonite Church will become a community of children and adults who build deeper relationships with each other. We will guide our children to learn God's Word and know Jesus personally. Opportunities for the spiritual growth of all ages will be provided as we boldly share God's love to the world.

The vision statement is a product of our Dream Team which consisted of Kim Kauffman, Lamar Miller, Rhonda Rhodes and myself, the input of the congregation through survey, and the guidance from the Holy Spirit. The Ministry Team also had a bit larger part than previous years though primarily in weighting the value of various ideas.

The first and perhaps most apparent idea that comes across is the children of the church. I see in these words a desire for adults to relate with children in everything from relating socially to walking with these kids in their journey of discipleship.

Another idea put forth is sharing the Good News while we grow. Not only does growing spiritually help enable us to share, but sharing encourages our own growth. This really is a vital activity.

These two ideas combine to shape the future of our church. There are many ways in which Arthur Mennonite would be a different church in the future than it is today regardless of this vision. Even if it is constituted of the same people, we would hope our walk with Jesus would continue to alter who we are as individuals and as a church. We also hope that we are not the same people but that we have added to our numbers those who would like to begin following Jesus. Both concepts are forms of growth and we hope this vision helps us focus on some areas that will encourage these specific forms of growth.

We hope you hold commissions and leadership accountable toward these objectives during the coming years. We also hope you find ways to embrace this vision and ways you can help Arthur Mennonite achieve these goals.
