It judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give an account." This one made me squirm a little, not out of fear but out of hope and reverence. God can transform my heart. There is no "me version" of the bible. God has explained, described, mapped out how to live and how to love if we allow him that opportunity to change our hearts. We allow God to love us. Allow God to be our confidence so we do not fall into the path of sin. Allow God to teach us how to love.


