

"How Will We Know?" by Nancy Kuhns, Minister of Community Life

Today is the first Sunday of Advent. Our Advent theme this year is "How Will We Know?" Each Sunday of Advent, a question will be asked and answers to those questions will be pondered. Many of us have questions and the answers are often hard to find. We find ourselves waiting; waiting for answers, waiting to hear from God. Like the Jews of the Bible who were waiting for the Messiah, we too are waiting. We are waiting for Jesus to return.

The question for the first Sunday of Advent is "How will we know...how long?" Most of us don't like to wait! We want quick answers and instant gratification. We use Google to get immediate information. We send a text to have instant communication. We get impatient when we have to wait too long but sometimes we must wait. We must wait for a child to be born, wait for test results, wait for wars to end, wait for an end to our grief and hurting. We might say as the ancient Jews did, "How long, O Lord? How long must we wait?"

The question for the second Sunday of Advent is "How will we know...what now?" We begin to ask ourselves "What shall we do while we wait?" We are called upon to be productive and to do kingdom work while we are waiting for Jesus to return. We are to be faithful servants as we work out our faith and draw closer to God.

The third Sunday of Advent asks, "How will we know...what's next?" The Bible reminds us that we often don't always get the answers we are wanting and the answers don't come as quickly as we would like. We often need to wait for God to answer our questions and our prayers. We have examples of people in the Bible who waited on God: Abraham waited for his promised child; the Children of Israel wandered for 40 years waiting to enter the Promised Land; Simeon lived his life waiting to see the Messiah. We need to remember that often God is waiting on us! He is waiting for us to give all parts of our lives to Him; He is waiting for us to trust Him in all things.

We end the Advent series with the question "How will we know...why me? Why not me?" We often feel inadequate for a job God calls us to do and ask "why me?" We think we are not worthy or important enough to do the work. We forget how often God uses ordinary, everyday people to carry out His work. Moses felt unqualified to lead the Children of Israel, Jesus' disciples were everyday people called to leave their jobs and follow Him. Every day God uses ordinary people to do extraordinary things!

I hope you join us for worship during this Advent season as we seek to answer the question, "How Will We Know?"
