

"Hope In the Lord"

This summer's theme in adult Christian Ed is "Hope in the Lord". What a timely topic!!! In the last few weeks many have faced hard, seemingly insurmountable things which can cause hope to falter. It can cause us to ask, "God, where were you? Why did you allow this to happen?" So far, the scriptures studied have included ones written by Paul, Jeremiah, and David. All three of these men faced hardships and trials which could have caused them to lose hope. In 2 Corinthians, Paul lists some of his sufferings saying that he had been in prison, he had been flogged and stoned, he had been shipwrecked. Jeremiah was persecuted for his prophecies and even thrown into a cistern because of them. Jeremiah watched Jerusalem fall and was taken into captivity and suffered along with God's chosen people. David spent years running from Saul who wanted to kill him, he endured rifts within his family including a son who rebelled against him and was killed. All these men had reason to give up hope yet they did not!! Their words and testimonies can be an inspiration to us as we face trials which cause us to feel hopeless and abandoned by God.

Paul writes in Hebrews 15:13 "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Our hope is in Jesus the Messiah, and Paul's words reassure us that we have not hoped in vain. God is a God of hope who, by the power of the Holy Spirit, fills his people with such joy and peace that they overflow with hope. Paul tells us in Romans 8 that nothing, absolutely nothing, can separate us from the love of God

In the book of Lamentations, Jeremiah laments over what has happened to his country and to himself. In chapter 3 after describing his feelings of affliction, bitterness, and deprivation, he writes these words of comfort. "Yet this I call to mind and therefore I have hope: Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." (Jeremiah 3:21-23) Jeremiah made a choice. He chose to believe in God's love even though he was experiencing difficult things. He chose to believe that God continued to be with him and his people and was walking with them in their troubled time.

David, too, made the decision to trust in God despite the circumstances of his life. In Psalm 71:14 David writes, "As for me, I will always have hope; I will praise you more and more." David continues and says he will tell of God's righteous deeds and proclaim His mighty acts to the next generation. He sums this up in verse 20, "Though you have made me see troubles, many and bitter, you will restore my life again; from the depths of the earth you will bring me up." He writes in Psalm 130:5, "I wait for the Lord, my whole being waits, and in his word I put my hope."

Hebrews 6:19 has these comforting words, "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure." An anchor provides stability in a storm, so that the boat will be intact after the storm passes. Christ does the same for us, He holds us together in the storms of life. I pray that the lives of these men and their words of hope can help us when we face storms in our lives. When you are feeling hopeless, turn to God's word and claim the hope that is found there.
