I have been preaching messages at AMC focused around the questions you submitted about life, faith, the Bible, and many other things. The title of this series has been "What About...?" earth. Until then, it's good to talk about them with each other and help each other discern how we are to live and follow Jesus on this journey of life we are on together.

Those in the Bible had questions as well. Cain asked if

he was his brother's keeper. On Mt. Carmel Elijah asked the people, "How long will you waver between two opinions?" Job asked, "If a man dies, will he live again?" David asked "How Long, O Lord?" Pilate asked, "What is truth?" Paul asked, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" Even Jesus is recorded as asking 307 questions in the Gospels. Many of those were to

drive home a point, expose deceitfulness, or to get people thinking.

It has been great to approach these questions together as God's people. The Bible is a wonderful source of wisdom and understanding for us. While we may not have all the answers and some questions are up for debate, we do know that the Lord and the Holy Spirit will lead, guide, and direct us if we continue to pray, discuss, and seek Godly direction. One of our 12 favorite scriptures at AMC is from Proverbs 3:5-6 which says, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight." To that we say, Amen!
