"A Season Of Loss" by Nadine Miller, Minister of Worship

I like my winter, but this winter has seemed extra long with the zero temperatures and the negative below wind chills. I think snow is so beautiful. There is something just so magical about it; it falls so quietly. I love all of my four seasons. After a long winter you are always ready for spring and warmer temperatures. New life starts to begin. The trees start budding, the birds are chirping, and the grass is turning greener. Everything is so fresh and new. Then you have summer where you can run barefoot in the grass and catch fireflies at night. You can grill out and stay outside longer and soak up some rays of sunshine. Fall comes next. I really enjoy fall and all the beautiful colors that come with nature and the turning of the leaves on the trees.

The last year and 9 months have been a very hard season for me and my family. We lost Ryan in April of 2023. The next day after we lost Ryan, Lamar had to have surgery to remove a kidney stone. Three days before Ryan died, we lost a sister- in-law. Lamar had shoulder surgery in April of 2024. In June of 2024 we lost Lamar's last brother. Lamar was then diagnosed with prostate cancer in August and had surgery in December. Most recently, our son-in-law lost his father unexpectedly in January.

What do you do when you feel like you have lost all hope and can't go on? What do you do when you feel like God has left you and you can't feel or hear from Him anymore? What do you do when you feel your prayers aren't being heard or you can't even pray? What do you do when you are desperate?

Job 23:3-4 says, "If only I knew where to find God, I would go to his court. I would lay out my case and present

my arguments. Then I would listen to his reply and understand what he says to me." Verses 8-9 go on to say, "I go east, but he is not here. I go west, but I cannot find him. I do not see him in the north, for he is hidden. I look to the south, but he is concealed."

I feel like we have been in this dark, depressing, loss of a season for such a long time and I am ready for a new season and new chapter in our lives. I know God doesn't promise us that there will not be trouble. John 16:33 says, "Here on earth you will have many trials and sorrows. But take heart, because I have overcome the world." God also promises that he will be with us in the trials. "When you go through deep waters, I will be with you. When you go through rivers of difficulty, you will not drown. When you walk through the fire of oppression, you will not be burned up; the flames will not consume you." Isaiah 43:2. We also find Psalms 46:1 says, "God is our refuge and strength, always ready to help in times of trouble."

So, what do you do in desperation? What do you do in that valley of dark times? What do you do when you can't feel His presence? You cry out to Him over and over and over again. You cry out daily and sometimes minute by minute. You just keep calling out to Him until you feel his presence again. You keep trusting even when you don't understand. You stay in His Word, even if you are numb and don't comprehend everything at the moment...you just keep reading your Bible. He will calm the storm and the sea to where you can breathe again and this dark season will lift and you will have joy again.




