“Built To Belong”

Rolling dunes and the rhythmic crashing of waves, white sand stretching endlessly under the sun’s warm glow, a salty breeze carries the soothing sound of surf and seagulls. Whether it’s the sparkle of morning tide or the glow of a coastal sunset, there’s something magical about the beach. I recently returned from a lovely family beach vacation. The sounds and sunsets will bury themselves in my memory.

While we were there, my son and I stole away on a golf cart and decided to take a tour of the beach town. As we slowly drive around we admire the beautiful beach homes. They often feature weathered wood or pastel-painted exteriors, large windows that reflect the sunlight, and wrap around porches perfect for ocean views. Many are accented with white trim, wooden shutters, and gently swaying hammocks or rocking chairs, all nestled among palms and sea grasses with the sound of waves nearby.

As we turn a corner, we come across some new construction. Alongside these beautiful homes we see a towering, sturdy concrete structure beginning to take shape. Gray walls rise from the ground, rough and unfinished, with steel rebar jutting from the tops like skeletal fingers waiting for the next phase. It’s a raw, powerful scene—foundations of permanence in progress. This house is not beautiful right now, but very soon there will be no visual evidence of concrete or rebar. There will be no visual evidence of steel beams or joists. Someone will come in and complete this home with all of the

beautiful finishing touches. I know that we often think of the church as a body of Christ, (as this is how the bible describes the church- 1 Corinthians 12) but I couldn’t help but think of the church as I was looking at this towering concrete wall. I may admire all of the ornate and beautiful details that make the house so appealing, but I can’t forget the essential parts that come together to create the whole.

I may sometimes feel like someone’s big personality or charming wit overshadows my reserved nature. I may feel inadequate to complete a task because my strengths do not fit into a certain wheelhouse. Sometimes I feel plain and ordinary. Sometimes I wonder if my work is “good enough”. Just like every part of a house has a purpose—whether seen or unseen—God has uniquely designed each person with specific gifts, personalities, and talents for a reason. In building His Kingdom, no role is too small, and no individual is without value. Every person is needed, just as the concrete, rebar, steel beams, pastel siding, and shimmering windows are all needed. Together, we reflect the fullness of God’s plan. When we each offer what we have, the Kingdom of Heaven grows stronger, more beautiful, and complete. Your purpose matters! Your presence matters! Your personality matters! Every person in God’s kingdom is irreplaceable! 1 Corinthians 12:18 “But our bodies have many parts, and God has put each part just where he wants it.” Don’t forget that you are perfectly equipped for your purpose.
